DETAILS OF INTERNAL ASSESSMENT SCHEME

TOTAL : 20 MARKS

Term end examination is complimented and supplemented with Internal Assessment (IA)

1. PERIODIC ASSESSMENT /TEST (05MARKS)

These would be restricted to 3 in each subject in a year and the average of best 2 would to be taken for final submission of marks.

2. MULTIPLE ASSESSMENT (05 MARKS)

(MI)can be done through observation, oral tests, individual or group work, class discussion, field-work, concept maps, graphic organizers, visual representation , quizzes, project-work, Self and peer assessment, collaborative projects, experiments, classroom demonstrations, etc.

3. PORTFOLIO (05 MARKS)

Besides class work, diverse curriculum outcomes can be achieved through journal, notebook, students artefacts, assignments, art integrated learning, etc.

4. SUBJECT ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES (05 MARKS)

Aim: Understanding, skill development, applying knowledge and critical thinking .

Languages- listening and speaking skills.

Science and Mathematics - practical work, investigatory projects and innovation.

Social Science-projects be related to Art and culture and development of Life Skills.

STRUCTURE OF ASSESSMENT SCHEME

The Assessment scheme will have an 80 marks component for Board examination (class X) and Annual Examination (class IX) in all subjects except compulsory subjects to be assessed internally along with a 20 marks component of Internal Assessment. Students have to secure 33 per cent in total in each of these components.

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SCHEME OF EXAMINATION & EVALUATION VI TO VIII

The Eight Point Grading Scale, as given by CBSE, for measuring Scholastic achievement (VI-VIII) is as follows:-

ATTENDANCE & LEAVE RULES

1. 75% attendance is compulsory for all students to be eligible to take the Final examination.
2. Those students who do not fulfill the minimum attendance of 75% will be fined at the rate of Rs 5 per day.
3. If a student remains absent for more than 15 consecutive days, his/her name will be struck off the roll.
4. All those students who are on medical leave during normal or examination days should submit a Medical Certificate to the Examination Incharge. No weightage will be given on this regard.
5. Half day leave will not be considered except on medical ground or an emergency.
6. Students feeling unwell should better stay back home instead of coming to school and then seeking permission to leave before the school is over.
7. No parents will be permitted to take their wards home during regular classes.

PROMOTION POLICY numbering instead of bullets

1. Appearance in assessments and examinations is compulsory.
1. Students are assessed on both Scholastic and Co-Scholastic areas.
2. Students of Classes IX and XI who score 33% and above in all subjects will only qualify for promotion to class X and XII respectively.
3. Marks of project work and practical work will not be added to promote the student in next class. It is compulsory to get pass marks in theory and practical separately in class XI.
4. In Class IX and XI, supplementary will be given only in one subject (provided he/she has secured at least 20% marks in the subject in which he /she has failed). If a student fails in two subjects, he/she will not be promoted to the next higher class.
5. To qualify in a subject under scholastic areas, a candidate must obtain minimum 33% of 20 marks in internal assessment (periodic tests, notebook submission & subject enrichment activities) and 33% marks in written exam.
6. In class IX, and X, if any, student fails in any one of the three elective subjects -- Science, Mathematics and Social Science, then it will be replaced by the skill subject offered as the sixth subject. The same will be followed in class XII for compulsory and optional subjects. The result will be computed based on the best five subjects. However, if a candidate desires to appear in the failed subject, he or she may appear along with the compartment examination.
7. Poor performance will entail denial of promotion to further classes.

SKILL SUBJECTS

1. The board is offering 17 skill subjects at the secondary level and 37 skill subjects as an additional sixth subject at the senior secondary level to upgrade the skills and proficiency of young generation and also to provide them awareness to explore various career options.
2. At the secondary level, a skill subject may be offered as an additional subject along with the existing five compulsory subjects.
3. The board has decided to offer students the flexibility of making a vocational choice of a short duration module of 12 hours at a stage in their early academic career, either at class VI, VII or VIII.
4. It would give students the necessary orientation early on so that they are able to make better choices at a later stage. This flexibility will keep multiple career possibilities open for each student.
